PAPER DEVELOPMENT WORKSHOP African Academy of Management (AFAM) 2018 Conference Addis Ababa, Ethiopia: January 6, 2018

The Editors of the *Academy of Management Discoveries* (*AMD*) -- the journal for empirical exploration in management and organizations -- invite submissions for its first African-based, paper development workshop. The purpose of this workshop is to help authors develop their ideas for papers that may ultimately be submitted for review in *AMD*.

About the Workshop:

This 90 minute session, held as part of the AFAM Conference will include a presentations by **AMD**'s Editor-in-Chief, as well as a roundtable, hands-on paper development discussion.

Presentation topics:

- Abductive reasoning, plausibility and the distinctive nature of AMD papers
- Surfacing phenomenon: Phenomenology and scale development research in AMD
- How to publish experimental research in AMD
- > Using big data and data exploration as a basis for theoretical insight
- > Is there a role for induction in AMD?

Roundtable paper development sessions:

- Up to 5 papers (selected on a competitive basis) presented, discussed and developed at each table.
- > The discussion will be led by AMD's editor-in-chief
- > Tables open to both paper authors and non-author participants
- Discussions will focus on framing, methodological rigor, empirical follow-up, interpretation, and specifying directions for down-the-road theorizing

Registration and Application to the Workshops:

- Link to register and/or upload your extended abstract: (registration site will open soon)
- As space is limited, preference will be given first to those whose papers are being discussed in the roundtables. Additional spots will be allocated on the basis of first come, first served.
- > Those who wish to have their paper reviewed and discussed should submit an extended abstract (between 5 and 10 pages of text) of their papers or paper ideas by DECEMBER 15. Abstracts will be accepted on a competitive basis.
 - * The abstract should provide a synopsis of the research question, its relevance and significance, a statement relating to the limited ability of extant concepts and/or theory to provide a coherent response to that question, the empirical approach, and the implications of the findings for down-the –road theorizing.
- Those who wish to participate in the workshop without submitting a paper for review and discussion need only register (registration site will open soon)
