AMD PAPER DEVELOPMENT WORKSHOP

Sun Yat-sen University, Lingnan (University) College Guangzhou, China January 27, 2018

The Editors of the **Academy of Management Discoveries** (**AMD**) – the journal for empirical exploration in management and organizations -- invite submissions for its first regional paper development workshop in China. The purpose of this workshop is to help authors develop their ideas for papers that may ultimately be submitted for review in *AMD*.

About the Workshop:

This event will include presentations by members of *AMD's* editorial team and *AMD* authors as well as roundtable, hands-on paper development discussions.

Presentation topics:

- > Abductive reasoning, plausibility and the distinctive nature of AMD papers.
- > Is there a role for induction in AMD?
- Surfacing phenomenon: Phenomenology and scale development research in AMD
- > How to publish experimental research in AMD
- > Meta-analysis and replication research in AMD
- Using big/secondary data as a basis for theoretical insight

Roundtable paper development sessions:

- > Up to 5 papers presented, discussed and developed at each table.
- > Each table discussion led by a current or founding AMD editorial team member
- > Tables open to both paper authors and non-author participants
- Discussions will focus on framing, methodological rigor, empirical follow-up, interpretation, and specifying directions for down-the-road theorizing

In each sequence, each editorial team member gives feedback on 3-4 papers. Authors give 5 minute presentation to the group. This is followed by 10-15 minutes of feedback

- As space is limited, preference will be given first to those whose papers are being discussed in the roundtables. Additional spots will be allocated on the basis of first come, first served.
- Those who wish to have their paper reviewed and discussed should submit an extended abstract (between 5 and 10 pages of text) of their papers or paper ideas by January 5, 2018. Abstracts will be accepted on a competitive basis.
- The abstract should provide a synopsis of the research question, its relevance and significance, a statement relating to the limited ability of extant concepts and/or theory to provide a coherent response to that question, the empirical approach, and the implications of the findings for down-the –road theorizing.
- Before you submit your extended abstract please make sure that your extended abstract is appropriate for AMD by reading AMD's Information for Contributors guidelines and the FAQs.
- AMD invites authors to submit manuscripts to the Special Issue on <u>Sustainable Development</u> <u>Goals</u>. Editors of the SDG special issue will attend many of these workshops and will be happy to work with potential special issue authors.
 - The SDG submission website will be open between July 1-30, 2018.
- Those who wish to participate in the workshop without submitting a paper for review and discussion need only register.
